

JHB297 Baby Labels freebie

Thank you so much for downloading this freebie. A quick, easy and stylish label especially for baby.


Add your own little message on the label to personalise your gift.

It is quick and easy to stitch and you can make a master piece out of each one with your fabric and threads.

The inside of the label gets a piece of fabric and then the detail embroidery that goes around it. What ever wording you wish to add to your label you can insert that either via your own software or via your edit screen and your build in fonts of your embroidery machine.

Now, the pictures of the steps to follow is from one of the designs of the set, but the procedure is the same, just the feathered satin stitch shape might be slightly different to what you will have in the freebie.

Hoop up your fabric, being a blanket, towel, garment or what ever you wish to personalise with some tear away stabilizer. I did mine on a little baby blanket that I added some lace and ribbon trim.




Thread up your machine with the colour you are going to do the border around the fabric in.

Stitch the first colour line directly onto the fabric. This is a placement line of where your fabric is going to go.



Float your fabric over this placement line.



Secure with the next colour line, still staying with your feathered satin outline colour. Secure with the next colour line which is a run stitch line and a combination zigzag and triple stitch line.



Remove hoop from the machine but not the design out of the hoop, and cut away the excess fabric close around the stitching line.



Place hoop back on the machine and stitch the feathered satin stitch outline.



From here on the design detail of each label will stitch.

I have used Marathon threads, and although I am giving you the thread colours I have used, you are so welcome to use the colour of your choice. Now remember, colour 3 is also the colour I used for my placement line and securing line of my fabric and that is my feathered satin stitch outline colour so this could be anything depending of your fabric.

Freebie colours

Colour 3 – lilac 1261

Colour 4 – blue/green 1099

Colour 5 – pink 1227

Colour 6 – yellow 1009

Colour 7 – yellow 1009
