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Appliqué bunny 2

**This motif was digitized for medium to heavy fleece fabrics.
I use Polar fleece.**

Hoop the project fabric for a fluffy blanket, pj top or fluffy pillow with tearaway stabilizer.
I did not use clear water-soluble topper.



Size: W 4.98 x H 4.79
Stitch count - 10405


Embroidery thread colors

Combine any colors to suit your project's fabric color. I use bright pastels.
Follow all the embroidery steps, adjust the colors and use throughout the motif.

I used Marathon:

- pale pink - 1193
- medium bright pink - 1027
- light blue - 1057
- bright blue - 1198
- light olive green - 1122
- medium olive green - 1330
- yellow - 1003
- lilac - 1060
- medium purple - 1081
- matt gold - 1017
- black

White bobbin fill.



1. With the same thread color as your project fabric, baste the layers together. Stitch the placement line for the appliqué.



2. steps 2 and 3: pink or the same color as your appliqué fabric. Cover bunny placement line with pink fleece. Baste appliqué in place.

Remove the hoop from the machine. Without distorting the embroidery, cut away all the fleece around the bunny appliqué. Trim this close to the stitches without stretching the fabric. Place the hoop back in the machine.



3. cover the raw edge with open zigzag.



4. bright pink or white for inner ear and paw pads.

5. same color thread as 2 and 3, satin stitch covering the entire bunny outline.

Continue with normal embroidery.

6. gold - swag

7. light olive - leaves 1

8. medium olive - leaves 2

9. lilac - flower petals

10. medium purple or pink - petal shading

11. white - eyes

12. black eyes

13. black, dark gray or any pink - nose and mouth.

14. light blue - small satin flowers and bow

15. bright blue - bow outline

16. pale pink - cheeks

17. yellow - flower centers

18. white - specks on eyes.

Remove the hoop from the machine. Trim any threads still showing. Remove all of the stabilizer.

Carefully remove the basting outline stitches.
