MEMO HOLDER



Supplies List

- Water soluble stabilizer (not the plastic kind)
- Compressed batting
- Same colour embroidery thread in bobbin & on top to match fabric colour
- Fabric
- A7 spiral note pad (spiral spring on the top of pad)

FABRIC SIZE

1 x Fabric 15cm x 27cm to be folded in half

1 x Compressed batting 15cm x 15cm

1 x Fabric 15cm x 21cm


1 x Compressed batting 15cm x 21cm

TIPS & INSTRUCTION INFORMATION

1. It is best to read the INSTRUCTIONS before you sew
2. Fabric facing RIGHT SIDE UP UNDER HOOP or DOWN UNDER HOOP means that when you have placed the bottom fabric UNDER the hoop & you turn the hoop the right side up the bottom fabric should be facing right side UP or DOWN according to the said direction in the instructions
3. Sewing STEPS in the PDF Instructions do not coincide with the sewing STEPS of the pattern. The bullets in each STEP of the PDF will be relatively close to the pattern steps on your flash drive or USB stick of your embroidery machine
4. Use colour THREAD to match your fabric. Most of the patterns requires only one colour thread. I use the same colour thread on the top & in the bobbin
5. FABRIC quantities varies in size of the project & according to your choice of fabric changes you make to your project
6. Many of the COLOUR STOPS in the pattern are for step changes
7. CUT OFF as close as possible (even if you sometimes snip the stitches) to your zigzag stitching & the batting stitching so that you don't have excess fabric & batting sticking out of your final satin stitching
8. DO NOT REMOVE YOUR WORK OUT OF THE HOOP TILL IT IS COMPLETED
9. Once you have completed a panel only cut the larger unwanted threads with a scissor and then singe gently with a lighter flame the fluffy unwanted threads (don't hold the flame too long against the satin stitches or they will burn)




Step 1: Place water soluble stabilizer in hoop & sew placement line for pocket & centre fold line



Step 2:

- Fold fabric in half
- Place centre fold line of fabric along the centre fold placement line
- Open up fabric & stitch down centre fold line (right side of fabric is facing stabilizer)
- Sew placement line for compressed batting



Step 3: Place batting over placement line & stitch down




Step 4:

- Cut off excess batting close to stitching



Step 5:

- Stitch down fabric around batting area
- Stipple batting area




BACK OF HOOP VIEW




Step 6:

- Fold fabric over at centre fold line & tape down so it does not pucker when sewn
- Stitch down fabric
- Stitch pattern at pocket opening
- Sew placement line for back of panel




BACK OF HOOP VIEW

Step 7: Place back fabric with right side facing stabilizer UNDER hoop & stitch down



BACK OF HOOP VIEW


Step 8: Place batting over back fabric UNDER hoop & stitch down

Step 9:

- Cut off excess batting close to stitching
- Cut out excess batting from inside circle area close to stitching
- Sew pencil partition line



BACK OF HOOP VIEW

Step 10:

- Place final fabric with right side facing away from stabilizer UNDER hoop & stitch down
- Zigzag around panel & circle area



FRONT OF HOOP VIEW



Step 11:

- Cut off excess fabric one layer at a time from top & bottom of hoop close to zigzag stitching
- Cut out excess fabric from inside circle close to zigzag stitching



Step 12:

- Finally satin stitch panel & inside circle area & remove from hoop
- Very carefully cut stabilizer from pocket area OR you can rinse out the stabilizer & dry



BACK OF HOOP VIEW



Open the spiral note book & slip the cover into the sleeve & the pencil into the pencil slot. Hook the Memo Holder wherever it is convenient so that you can jot down your notes before you forget
