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These designs are free standing. Use your favourite water soluable stabilizer. I have the best results with Vilene. Hoop the stabilizer and embroider the design. Stabilizer should be hooped "drum tight" – firm but not stiff as a board. When you tap on it there should still be some flexibility otherwise the threads would pull together without being bound properly. Depending on your machine, you might need to slow down the speed. Always use sharp needle to avoid thread breakage. After embroidering the designs, soak them in the water but not too long to keep some stiffness. Lay them flat on towel or between two towels and iron while they are still a little bit damp. Zipped file contains tags with and without an eye for hanging.
