
These designs are free standing. Use your favourite water soluble stabilizer.

I have the best results with Vilene.

Hoop the stabilizer.

It should be hooped „drum tight“ – not droopy but also not stiff as a board. When you tap on it, there should still be some flexibility otherwise the threads would pull together without being bound properly.

It is advisable to slow down the stitching speed. Always use sharp needle to avoid thread breakage.



Bring up the design on the screen of the machine. If it's easier for your work, change the colors to the ones you prefer since the display might not show proper colors that have been set.



Embroider the lace base.

Make sure to check the thread tension. If the bobbin tension is too high, it might destroy the lace as the threads would not interlock properly.



The lace base should look almost the same on the right and wrong side.



Now embroider the floral part of the design.



After the design is done, remove the hoop from the machine and release the sewout.



Cut the excess stabilizer, be careful not to cut the lace. Trim the thread tails and soak the embroidery in the water.



Do not leave it there for too long as you need to keep some stiffness of the lace.

Motives can be wavy when the stabilizer is gone, just lay them flat on towel or between some fabric and iron thoroughly either when dry or while they are still a little bit damp.

In case the lace has been left in the water for too long, use some kind of starch to reinforce it so that it holds its shape better.
